Professor Randell is an award-winning global mentor, educator, trainer, author, speaker, company director, change activist, ambassador, patron and campaigner for human rights. Shirley has provided specialist technical assistance to governments and agencies in the Asia Pacific Region and in Africa over the last 20 years as a leading expert in public sector and institutional reform, teacher education, gender mainstreaming and human rights in developing countries. From 2006-2014, she was based in Kigali, Rwanda. Shirley was Senior Gender Adviser, East Central Africa Region for the Netherlands Development Agency (SNV). In 2010, with the encouragement of women parliamentarians, Shirley founded and was first Director of the Centre for Gender, Culture and Development at the Kigali Institute of Education. She founded the Rwanda Association of University Women. Prior to her international work, she had significant experience at Commonwealth, State and Local Government levels in Australia. Shirley was the second woman and the first schools sector executive to be President of the Australian College of Educators 1987-89. In the 1980s she convened a series of ACE conferences on women in educational leadership, in early childhood, primary, secondary and tertiary education. Shirley was an Australian Inaugural Women of Influence in 2012, a TIAW World of Difference Awardee in 2013, and is a Distinguished Alumna of the University of Canberra and the University of New England Armidale. She is Conjoint Professor of Practice in the School of Education, University of Newcastle.
